ABOUT UNITED WAY

In 1945 a small group of volunteer businessmen formed the Scottsbluff Community Chest, now known as United Way of Western Nebraska, an independent fundraising association, its purpose was to raise funds for ten prominent community charities. The first campaign raised \$26,359, which was distributed among those ten agencies. Throughout the years, other agencies have joined our association. Agency names changed, agencies merged and some simply no longer exist. Today there are 15 member agencies through the main office, including one of the original agencies, Boy Scouts, 10 partner agencies in Box Butte County and 3 member agencies in Dawes County.

As population has grown, so have the needs of our community. United Way of Scotts Bluff County was formed to help meet many of those growing needs. In 2004, the organization expanded to cover more of the Nebraska panhandle becoming United Way of Western Nebraska. Due to the specific needs in the Alliance area, United Way of Western Nebraska serving Box Butte County was opened soon after. In 2016, the service area of Box Butte County was expanded to include Dawes County becoming United Way of Western Nebraska serving Box Butte and Dawes Counties under the umbrella of United Way of Western Nebraska.

In 2020, we celebrate our 75th anniversary of helping people in Western Nebraska.

RESPONDING TO COVID-19

United Way of Western Nebraska launched the COVID 19 Community Compassion Fund to help organizations and individuals in most need of assistance. An Ad Hoc Advisory Committee was formed to work with United Way to advise on the direction and implementation of support to address the needs in the community.

This fund provides nonprofit organizations with flexible resources to address the impact of the COVID-19 public health crisis on our community or other publicly declared crisis, including immediate basic needs, gaps in service, and operational challenges.

\$26,463.68 was raised with 100% of the funds distributed to programs assisting with COVID-19 related needs.
